The Champlain Park and Vicinity Residents' Association was established around 1967 with the goal to improve and promote the quality of life of our community of over 550 residencies. Each year, the Association organizes several community events and provides services to its members, as well as representing them in meetings with the public and political authorities. In addition, the Association communicates with residents through its Facebook page and electronic newsletters to inform them about issues such as urban development, public consultations and, of course, activities that are organized by the Association.

Due to the demographic composition of the neighbourhood, the Association communicates both in French and English with its members. On the Facebook page, everyone is free to communicate using the language of their choice.

Members of the Association pay an annual fee that allows them to have FREE access to all the organized activities. When it comes to discuss issues with the authorities, all the residents are represented by the Association. In the last few years, we have seen membership fluctuate due to residents moving or the challenge of keeping the membership database up to date and collecting fees. Issues the Association continues to work on and raise concerns with the city include: limiting speed on our streets, managing and updating the infrastructures in St-Malo Park, repaving of Chemin McConnell, creating sidewalks for pedestrians, etc.

The Association is also in constant communications with other neighbourhood associations on issues of common interest such as traffic on Chemin d'Aylmer, residential developments, public transport, etc.

The Association has some equipment for its activities and some items can be lent/rented at low cost by members.



#### **SEPTIC TANK MAINTENANCE**

Septic tanks need to be emptied every two years and proof must be sent to the City of Gatineau. Find out more from the company servicing you if they send the proof themselves, as many companies due this as a rule.

#### MAINTENANCE OF DITCHES

Every homeowner is responsible for the maintenance of the ditch on their property.

Homeowners are equally obliged to manage their ditches along the public access situated at the outlets in front of or besides their lots, to make sure nothing is obstructing the drainage of water.

The maintenance required by the city consists of the removal by hand, or with the use of a brush cutter, all the debris or vegetation that obstruct the flow and drainage of the water. It is forbidden to deviate the flow of water or to fill in or undertake construction that modifies the form or layout of ditches along the public access way.

#### WATER ANALYSIS

The laboratory of the city offers a service to perform the analysis of drinking water and water used, as per the ISO/CEI 17025 standard, recognized by the Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Climate Change of the Province of Quebec. This assures rigorous and professional results.

It is recommended to undergo microbiological tests during periods when rise of contamination is the highest:

- In Autumn, when there is a high accumulation of rainwater; and
- In Spring, when the snow melts.

A more complete analysis is required during the installation of new wells, during renovations and when there are noticeable changes in the characteristics of the water flow. If microbiological contamination is detected in your well, it is recommended to disinfect the well by following the protocol of disinfection (follow the link). You should go to the laboratory to obtain containers for your water samples as well as the sampling instructions.

### GARBAGE PICKUP, RECYCLING AND COMPOST

#### Bulky items-garbage

Since August 30, 2018, oversized garbage (destined for the dump) can be brought free of charge to the waste transfer centre (860 boulevard de la Carrière, Gatineau).

This free service is provided to citizens, property owners and small business owners in Gatineau. Articles allowed free of charge include all objects destined for the dump; for example: covered furniture, matresses, carpets, oversized objects made of plastic (objects that can not be brought to an ecocentre).



- ·Composting: Compostable materials are forbidden in garbage bins, as was already the case for recyclables. A brown bin has been provided for your use by the City and collection is done weekly.
- ·Recycling: A blue bin has been provided for your use by the City and collection is done every two weeks, alternating with garbage collection.
- ·Garbage: Gray bins of 120 liters for household garbage collection have been provided for your use by the City. Household garbage collection is done every two weeks. As of a few years ago, the volume of the garbage container will be limited to 120 liters. This bin alone as well as surplus bags (at a charge) will be allowed to be collected at the end of your driveway.
- ·Bulky items and construction residues: These are no longer picked up with other household garbage.

Download the application DTRITUS! This free application allows you to rapidly:

- ·find out how to get rid of materials or find out which bin to use for their disposal;
- ·find out your garbage collection day and obtain a personalized calendar for your address;
- ·receive notifications the day before garbage pickup as well as alerts about the special collection dates.

The Gatineau and Outaouais rivers were the scene of commercial activity between the first inhabitants of North America, including the Algonquins. From the 17th century, exchanges intensified with the arrival of missionaries and the "coureurs des bois".

Colonization of the Outaouais began in 1800 with the arrival of Philemon Wright and his wife Abigail Wyman. Mr. Wright recognized the economic potential of the immense forest of red and white pines covering the territory. Quickly, the region became the hub of the forestry industry in North America. In the 19th century, the region played a leading role in the forestry and pulp and paper industries, as well as in hydroelectric and mining industries.

Neighboring Ottawa and its suburbs, Gatineau is undoubtedly a dynamic city that benefits from its geographic location in the heart of Canada's capital region.







The City of Gatineau occupies a territory of 348.5 km2. The fourth largest city in Quebec, Gatineau has a population of nearly 285,000. It forms, in conjunction with Ottawa, the fourth largest urban area in the country with more than one million people.



#### A REPRESENTATIVE LOGO

The City of Gatineau is identified by a unifying symbol formed by a stylized G. The three undulating shapes represent the rivers flowing through the city from west to east and from north to south. These three elements, added to the green ribbons that separate them, recall the five municipalities at the origin of the city: Aylmer, Buckingham, Gatineau, Hull and Masson-Angers. Blue evokes water and clean air; green, nature, growth and security.







It includes services related to taxation and assessment, payment of fines and pleading, regulations and permits, as well as recreation and culture.
